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THE BRIEF

As well as state-of-the-art appliances, the kitchen has a totally integrated lighting system creating a wonderful atmosphere in the evenings which is accentuated by the use of glass shelving. Innovative storage systems such as the Mondeo carousel unit provide plenty of usable space.

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THE BRIEF

This kitchen features high-gloss doors in a soft cappuccino cream. But what really makes this kitchen shine is the use of dark walnut on the exposed ends of the cabinets, plinth, and cornice; adding a stunning contrast to the kitchen. Solid wood flooring brings this scheme together beautifully. There's plenty of storage space in the floor-to-ceiling cupboards on the right-hand wall, and appliances are discreetly incorporated into the overall design.

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CONSTRUCTION: This kitchen features Caesar Desert Limest Quartz worktops, tiled flooring and curved units. The central island unit includes an integrated wine cooler and glass storage cupboard.




THE BRIEF


